Clean Schools, Clean Rivers:

DC Greenworks is the proud recipient of our second two-year grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation's Chesapeake Bay Small Watershed Program. Between 2012 and 2014, DC Greenworks will build green stormwater infrastructure at Maury Elementary, Eliot-Hine, and Eastern High School. As part of this project, we will provide community education to benefit the Anacostia River and the Chesapeake Bay.

Green Roof DVD and Manual:

Through funding from the District Department of the Environment, DC Greenworks is creating a manual and DVD that will serve as a unique, and much needed, tool to help those in the green roofing sector to overcome the major challenges they face. These materials will detail the green roof process from planning and permitting, to installation, use and maintenance.

1,000 Rain Barrels:

DC Greenworks is well on track to achieve our short term goal of installing 3,500 rain barrels throughout Washington, DC by 2015! In 2011-2012, we installed 1,000 rain barrels through DDOE's RiverSmart Homes Rain Barrel Installation Program. In 2012, we received a renewal of this grant to install another 1,000 rain barrels.
