Two grants came through, including "Greener Schools, Cleaner Rivers II", a continuation of the Greener Schools, Cleaner Rivers project awarded by the National Fish and Wildlife Fund to DC Greenworks in 2010. Focused again on schools in DC's Capitol Hill, DC Greenworks will work in partnership with Maury Elementary School, Eliot-Hine Middle School and Eastern High School to collaboratively select, design and

install green infrastructure stormwater retrofits on school grounds.

A District Milestone for Rain Barrels



As of last month, 2100 132 gallon barrels provided through the RiverSmart Homes program were taking 831,600 gallons of rain water off the streets and out of the system. With the installation of barrel number 2100, we begin a new grant cycle that will make available a 30' low-pressure soaker hose with each installation.
